- -Hyrum and Permelia had the following children: Hiram Miles, Permilia Mindwell, Nancy Bascom, Ann Harrington, Lysander, Myriah, Moses Bundy, William Wallace, Moroni, Louisa, Lauvura Myril.
- -Hyurm had quite a few wives. His first plural wife was Sophia Lance who he married in 1846. Two years later he married two more wives, Nancy and Mary Lance. In 1857 he married Lucy Ann Millard. In 1870, eleven years before his death, Hyrum married three more wives, Nancy Allen, Mindwell Bundy, and Louisa Jones.
- -Hiram and his wife Permelia were baptized by the Prophet Joseph Smith in 1832. (Autobiography of Hiram Dayton, Family and Land and Records Office, LDS Visitor's Center, Nauvoo, Illinois).
- -Hiram traveled to most of the northern U.S. states preaching the gospel. In his testimony he stated that he and his wife never murmured despite losing \$30,000 in property to mobs. (Autobiography of Hiram Dayton, Family and Land and Records Office, LDS Visitor's Center, Nauvoo, Illinois).

-It is said that Joseph Smith gave Hiram a silver dagger. He told Hiram that whoever was wearing it would not be killed by mobs. The knife is still untarnished and owned by a descendent of Hiram. (Hiram Dayton and his Silver Dagger, emailed file).
