At the end of another mission, he traveled home with the Warren S. Snow Company in 1864. He died in route. The Hyde and Snow companies traveled closely together and his wife, Ellen, is listed as a member of the Hyde company. His death in route is confirmed in the obituary of his daughter, Annie Kay Hardy.
