Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? Listed as family #1225 in District 21, Pottwattamie County, Iowa.

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Went west with the Warren Foote Company in 1850. About 540 individuals and 104 wagons were in the company when it began its journey from the outfitting post at Kaneshville, Iowa.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

My Father, Charles Alphonzo Terry, son of Otis and Cynthia Ruggles Terry, was born November 10, 1821, in Otsego County, New York. His grandparents came from Massachusetts. He, with his father's family, moved to Michigan. Here it was that he met and married Phylinda Loveridge, October 18, 1842, the ceremony being performed by Ezra Williams. Here, too, he accepted the gospel. He was baptized a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and blessed at Pleasant Valley, Michigan, in May, 1843. The officiating elder was M. Serrine. From Michigan, the family moved to Nauvoo, Illinois, to join the body of the church. Here it was that he received a Patriarchal blessing from John Smith in 1845. Here, too, he was ordained an elder in June 1844, by Wilford Woodruff. His first son, Wilford, was born August

13, 1845, at Knoxville, Illinois. In January 1846, he was ordained a Seventy and the same month and year he received his endowments in the Nauvoo temple, January 14, 1846. When the Latter-day Saints were driven from Nauvoo, he and his family moved to Winter Quarters until they could arrange their affairs to cross the plains. Here it was that the second son, Brigham Alphonzo was born, January 15, 1848 and died one month later on February 15, 1848. The loss of this child was such a blow to the mother that her health began to fail. In 1850, Charles A. Terry crossed the plains to the Salt Lake Valley, with the family. They were members of the Captain Warren Foote's Company which left Kanesville, Ohio, June 15, and arrived in Salt Lake, September 17, 1850. His elder brother, Otis Lysander, was captain of 50; his father, Otis, was Captain of 10, in the same company.
