However, he later participated as one of the rescuers sent out in the winter of 1856 to assist the handcart pioneers stranded in Wyoming.

John Harvey was a private in Company D of the Mormon Battalion.

About the year 1816 there lived by the seashore of Glasgow, Lanarkshire, Scotland, a humble family whose sire was Robert Harvey. The mother was Ann McDonald, and they had five sons, John, Robert, Frank, Alexander, and William, and two daughters, Ann and Margaret.

John Harvey. Born Dec. 12, 1816. In the village of Balleston Lanarkshire, Scotland, 5 miles from the City of Glasgow. John loved the sea and left his family one night for America. The family (John's father and family came later) they sailed from Greenock on the 4th of May 1831 John came to Utah in 1848. Captain of President Young's 1st Company with President Young's family. He lived in the family home sometime after he came there. He had lived on the frontier for many years. He was called with other men to go on a sort of mission to Fort Supply to help raise grain for others who were coming. Married Eliza Everett in 1831. Their children were John, Murray, Margaret A. etc. He married Ann Coope Minchell July 23, 1854. In 1875 was called on a mission to take charge of lumber teams from Mr. Trumbell to St. George hauling lumber for the temple. There six months. was first assessor of Wasatch County. was a Blackhawk Warrior and did a great deal of pioneering.
