Susannah Eliza Baker had a daughter, Eliza Jane, who was born on April 2, 1848 at Winter Quarters, Nebraska. Susannah died 16 days after Eliza Jane was born. Susannah's mother died about a year before Susannah died. This left Benjamin Baker, the baby's grandfather, as the caretaker for the baby. He asked the Harvey's to foster the baby. John Harvey and Eliza Averett Harvey raised Eliza Jane as their foster daughter. They had lost twin babies about a month before Eliza was born. Eliza Jane kept close ties to the Baker family. Eliza Jane married Henry Ohlwiler and had 5 children. She died in Heber City, Wasatch County, Utah in 1927.
