Ann Bocking was born on 27 July 1799 in Derbyshire, England. On October 25, 1841 William and Ann Bocking Smith both received patriarchal blessings in Manchester, England. They received their endowments April 6, 1846 in the Nauvoo temple. After William's death in 1847, Ann married Joseph Billington and they were in the 1856 Iowa census. Ann and Joseph Billington were in the 1848 Brigham Young Company. In the 1850 Utah US Census, John Smith is living with Ann Bocking Smith and Joseph Billington. Ann and her son John Smith were both rebaptized in Salt Lake. Ann received a second patriarchal blessing in Salt Lake.
