Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Emma came with her mother's sister Elizabeth Terry Heward and her husband John and their baby Sarah. They traveled in the Brigham Young Company which left from Winter Quarters on June 5, 1848 and arrived Sep. 20-24, 1848.

-Emma Amanda Young is the daughter of Jane and George. (Family Group Record, Ancestral File)

-Jane married George Tarbox, abt 1836, Canada. He died January 1838, Quincy, Adams, Illinois. She married George W. Young, Abt 1840, Illinois. He died Fall of 1846 at Camp, Polk, Iowa.

-Emma was cured of a canker she had just before they began the trek to Salt Lake. Elizabeth, her aunt reported that she would cry when asked to pick up buffalo chips or care for her cousin Sarah. (Elizabeth Terry Heward, Autobiography and journal 1853-1860, 20-21,

According to Find a Grave under Parshall Terry, III, Hannah's (Jane's mother) maiden name was "Terry." She was born 8 October 1876 in Goshen, New York, to Joshua Terry and Elizabeth Parshall.

Parshall Terry III was a toll-gate keeper at Red Butte Canyon Road in Salt Lake County in 1849. In 1856, he was a toll-gate keeper over the Jordan River at Lehi. He was also a toll-gate keeper in Provo Canyon in 1858.
