Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? Utah County, Utah, house #65. (Household included Ruth 32, Mary Ann 23, Frederick 19, Sarah 15, Isaac 14, Charlotte 10, George 9, Joseph 5, Frances K. 1).

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? Theodore and his wife Mary Clift with their children came with the Silas Richards Company from Kaneshville on July 10, 1849 and arrived Oct. 25-29.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

- Hyrum Smith Turley was born as a twin to Joseph Smith Turley. His twin, Joseph died one month before him on March 5<sup>th</sup>. Their mother, Sarah Ellen also died at Winter Quarters shortly after the twins on May 4, 1847. Theodore and Sarah Clift's only other child, Princetta died the same year as her mother and brothers at age two while living at Winter Quarters also. She died on Sep. 2, 1847. Thus, Hyrum Smith Turley's only immediate family to make it to Utah was his father, Theodore. (<https://winterquarters.byu.edu/Portals/121/PAF/ward15/b26.htm#P920>).
