- Martha Ann was buried in the same grave as her daughter Martha Jane.
- To honor his dead wife her husband changed the name of their 7th child from Hannah Adelaid to Martha Jane.
- Her husband, Joseph was born in Cambridge Massachusetts. In the 1850 census he's listed as a stone cutter.
- The couple moved from Massachusetts to Illinois because business was poor in the east and Joseph's brother asked him to come practice medicine with him. Joseph did so for two years before joining the church and moving to Nauvoo.
- Both Martha and her husband were very sick shortly before she died. Her last words were concerning the care of her sick baby and sick husband. He recovered enough to sit with her during her last few hours and commented that she looked very peaceful.
- After Martha's death Joseph married three other times.
- on the trip from Nauvoo to Winter Quarters Brigham Young drove the Hovey wagon for a day because both Joseph and Martha were too sick to drive. Brigham Young let Martha and the two children ride in the buggy wagon and shared his tent with the family as well. This occurred about two weeks before Martha's death.
- After Martha died Joseph boarded the baby Martha Jane, originally named Hannah, for a dollar a week with sister Dunlap.
