Which Winter Quarters Ward or Iowa Branch was the family? Winter Quarter 7th Ward

Where was the family in the 1850 U. S. Census? Unknown, but in the 1880 census Andrew and his wife Elizabeth are in San Bernardino, California (sheet 503D).

Which Pioneer wagon train took the family west? They took the Willard Richards Company which left Winter Quarters July 3, 1848 and arrived Oct. 10, 1848 in Salt Lake. In addition to Phelina's mother and father, Thomas, 4 years old, and Silas, 5 years old went west with the family.

Any interesting facts or stories that might have been submitted.

- By 1852 the Cox family was living in San Bernardino. In December of 1852 an 11-month son died.

- Andrew J. Cox established a saw mill in California within a couple years. He was able to do this after gaining a 160-acre plot from the government for unclaimed timber lands. (http://signaturebookslibrary.org/san-bernardino-03/)

- Phelina was born in Noxubee, Mississippi. Both of her parents were born in South Carolina
