- William was the 6th of 8 children. He was named after his father's father.

- His father, Alvah, received his patriarchal blessing from Joseph Smith Sr.
- Alva was disfellowshipped in April 1860 but reinstated the following year.
- William's sister, Asina or Aseneth, died one year before him in Nauvoo.
- At the time of William's death he had one sister, Nancy, who was 9.
- During the trek to Utah Alva was a captain of 10.- Alva had 5 wives.
