-She was born in Salem, New Jersey.

-She died at age 34.

William traveled to the valley in Brigham Young's 1847 company and was part of the 6th Company of Ten led by Charles Shumway. He was re-baptized in the Salt Lake Valley on 8 August 1847. At the time of the 1850 federal census (early 1851) he has living in Utah County. His name first appears in the records of the Utah Territorial Militia on 27 September 1851. He was a member of the 6th Quorum of Seventy. At various times in his life, particularly in Nauvoo, his surname was spelled in sources as "Wordsworth." In Utah, it was spelled "Wadsworth" in the census, obituary, property list, and numerous

newspaper articles. His gravestone shows his surname as "Wordsworth."
